

Dear friends, supporters and students of Living University,

After nine months of preparation the faculty and staff are pleased to report that the University's application for licensure authorization and its Compliance Report to expand its undergraduate program were sent today to the University of North Carolina General Administration (UNCGA). UNCGA is the licensing agency in North Carolina. The University looks forward to a visit from a UNCGA Team of Examiners and the feedback it will provide to further strengthen the University. Our plan is to implement the new programs with the fall semester in August 2015.

The specific activity for which we have made licensure application is with respect to the following programs of study:

- Associate of Arts
- Baccalaureate Degree Minor in Business
- Baccalaureate Degree Minor in Communications
- Undergraduate courses in the arts and sciences and in selected business and professional disciplines (accounting, business, education, nutrition, and physical education.)



This report confirms the University's pursuit of excellence in education and its pursuit of truth and fact, and verifies that it is an exemplary community of teachers and learners. We have made it clear to UNCGA that Living University is a faith-based institution of higher learning affiliated with Living Church of God. And more specifically, that it is a Christian institution of higher learning serving the clear needs of the membership of its founding fellowship, the Living Church of God headquartered in Charlotte, North Carolina. Led by the efforts of presiding evangelist Dr. Roderick C. Meredith, Living University was founded on February 27, 2007, in response to the Church's growing need for university-educated personnel and to further edify the Church's world-wide membership and their families.



We believe that by expanding our program more fine young adults will decide to come to Charlotte for on-campus study. The addition of the associate of arts degree should provide them with the same opportunity that thousands of students had in attending Ambassador College when I served there as its chief academic officer—the opportunity to see God as the source of truth in mathematics, science, history, music,

and all other disciplines. The associate degree program is another resource for our providing the youth and young adults in God's Church opportunity to experience converted teachers, a campus with a biblical worldview, a smaller student body, a wholesome learning environment, more personal attention from faculty, less distractions and stress, courses emphasis on subjects and teaching deemed by God to be of first importance, and an engaging social life with young people of similar values.

As a Christian institution, Living University offers a values-based higher education wherein “The Word of God Is the Foundation of Knowledge.” We remain dedicated to our collective quest of restoring true values in an ever-changing world and applying them in laying the foundation for a better life. In a recent survey 87.2% of our students told us they will or have achieved their goals upon completing their studies at LU; 96.8% would recommend these studies to a friend; and 98.4% reported that all things considered they were satisfied with their studies with us. The University seeks to provide students with a positive educational experience and a strong biblical and academic foundation for all the things God will call upon them to do in the years ahead.



As Living University moves forward we continue to seek God’s guidance and direction in planning and implementing our University programs and activities. As we prepare for the future, we have increasing financial needs in supporting student scholarships, our faculty, staff and on-campus student workers, and in expanding our library resources and course offerings. Your continuing prayers and financial support is greatly appreciated and has benefitted scores of our students worldwide.

For example, so far this academic year we have given out 239 financial aid awards and scholarships to students across nine nations – with many scholarships yet-to-be-applied as students continue registering for the spring semester 2015. Additionally, your generous donations have assisted with employing two student workers who assist LU with both its financial operations and the operation of the rapidly growing on-site Library. In the future we hope to offer additional scholarships to students, expand library holdings and computer-based resources, and continue to employ students to assist with essential university functions. Your assistance and generosity with these projects is both greatly appreciated and also very important.

Please continue with us in asking God to bless our graduates, students and the University so we can remain in keeping with His will as we move forward.
